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INTRODUCTION

WHO SHOULD USE THIS TOOLKIT?

This toolkit is intended as a resource to support people engaged in program, district, and facility-level planning for implementation and roll-out of the 2010 revised WHO guidelines.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THIS TOOLKIT?

This toolkit is the second of three integrated toolkits to support country teams in adaptation and implementation of the revised WHO recommendations in the four linked technical areas: ARV drugs for treatment of pregnant women living with HIV and prevention of HIV infection in infants, infant and young child feeding in the context of HIV, antiretroviral therapy for HIV infection in infants and children, and antiretroviral therapy for HIV infection in adults and adolescents. The Phase 1 Toolkit: *Understanding the Revised WHO Recommendations and Supporting Their Adaptation Into National Guidelines* was released in July 2010 and the Phase 3 Toolkit: *Measuring Impact and Implementation of the Revised WHO Guidelines* has an anticipated release in early 2011. Please note that these tools are living documents. They will be revised in accordance with feedback from ongoing efforts to pilot the tools in countries.

The Phase 2 toolkit is organized into nine tool sets that include various categories of implementation planning tools. In most cases these tools consist of templates, which are frameworks to help country teams think through program, district, or site implementation planning. These tools do not need to be used in a particular sequence. The nine tools sets included in this toolkit are as follows:

2. District Implementation Roll-Out Planning Tools
3. Costing Implementation of the Revised PMTCT Guidelines Tool
4. Site Implementation Roll-out Planning Tools
