THE ELIZABETH GLASER PEDIATRIC AIDS FOUNDATION (EGPAF) IS THE GLOBAL LEADER IN THE FIGHT TO END AIDS IN CHILDREN.

Since our inception 25 years ago, EGPAF has helped to achieve a 90% decline in new HIV infections in the U.S., and over a 50% decline in the number of new infections in children worldwide. Nearly 25% of all infections averted in children globally are through EGPAF partner programs following core strategies set by the U.S. President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief. The elimination of new infections is within our reach. Our model takes a unique three-pronged approach to advance research, advocacy, and service delivery to end new infections in children and families while improving overall maternal and child health and creating sustainable health systems. EGPAF engages in the most affected regions in the world, and has a global footprint reaching 7,000 sites in 14 countries with a particular focus in Africa. We work together with existing local partners to scale quality programs that will be locally-owned and led when EGPAF exits. Our programs touch more than 2.5 million pregnant women and families each year.

LEADERSHIP



GOALS AND STRATEGIES

GOAL 1

Advance research and innovation to prevent, treat, and end pediatric HIV/AIDS.

- Support, conduct, and catalyze research that will lead to the end of new HIV infections in children and families.
- Support, conduct, and catalyze research that advances treatment to keep children and families alive and healthy.
- Support and catalyze research that will lead to a cure and vaccine to end pediatric HIV/AIDS.
- Enhance country capacity to conduct rigorous program evaluation and research that improves program effectiveness to end pediatric HIV/AIDS.
- Identify approaches to build safe, effective, and scalable HIV/AIDS services that strengthen maternal and child health systems.
- Document, translate, disseminate, and utilize research findings to advance policies and mobilize resources at the national, regional, and international levels.

GOAL 2

Advocate for global, national, and local policies, resources, and partnerships to end pediatric HIV/AIDS.

- Influence the development of global, national, and local policies to end new infections in children and keep families healthy through strengthened health systems.
- Mobilize issue leaders, policymakers, and development partners to provide substantial financial support for programmatic and research efforts that accelerate the end of pediatric HIV/AIDS.
- Promote global, national, and local policies that reinforce the rights of women and children to

access HIV/AIDS services and empower them to lead full and healthy lives.

- Promote programs that enable children and adolescents affected by HIV/AIDS to stay healthy.
- Advocate for national government accountability to eliminate pediatric HIV/AIDS by supporting host governments in the development of appropriate policies, nationally-owned HIV/AIDS plans, and the implementation of national guidelines.

GOAL 3

Expand high quality, locally-owned HIV/AIDS services to end new infections in children and keep families healthy through strengthened health systems.

- Through technical assistance, support country governments to achieve national coverage of women, children, adolescents, and families with comprehensive HIV/AIDS services within health facilities and communities.
- Promote and facilitate the integration of quality HIV/AIDS services with maternal, newborn, child, and reproductive health services that keep families healthy and end pediatric HIV/AIDS.
- Drive innovative strategies and interventions that accelerate program outcomes, impact, efficiency, and effectiveness through the maximal use of data and evidence-based approaches in program planning, implementation, and management.
- Strengthen documentation and dissemination of program results, promising practices, and lessons learned to inform and contribute to the global body of knowledge that facilitates expansion of comprehensive HIV/AIDS services.
- Support governments, national civil society organizations, and communities to build local capacity and strengthen health systems to end pediatric HIV/AIDS.

MEASUREMENT AND IMPACT

EGPAF's vision is a world in which children and families live free from HIV/AIDS. Our progress in realizing this vision will be measured by the reduction and eventual elimination of new infections in children as well as the improved health and well-being of children and families affected by HIV/AIDS around the world. The Foundation will continue to build upon the pillars of its work in research, advocacy, and service delivery while building the capacity of local and national institutions to drive and sustain this effort.
